- *The exam contains Sanskrit terminology. You may cross-reference study with our AD Resource Guide to familiarize yourself with Sanskrit that may be on the exam*
- You will have 210 minutes to complete the exam.
- The AD Beta Exam costs \$100 USD.
- The exam is Pass/Fail.
- There are two versions of the exam you may choose from:
 - On-Site Proctored (OSP)
 - On-Line Proctored (OLP)

- You will receive your results for the exam once we reach a critical mass of test takers and the cut score is established.
